ELIGIBILITY

Candidates for the Certified Peer Specialist training must have lived experience in recovery from a behavioral health concern, and a strong desire to identify themselves as a person in recovery from a behavioral health diagnosis (current or former consumer of behavioral health services).

- Hold a GED or High School diploma and be at least 18 years of age. An applicant may be requested to provide a copy of this document.
- O Demonstrate strong reading comprehension and written communication skills as indicated by their responses on the pre-test.
- Have demonstrated experience with leadership, advocacy, or governance, and be well grounded in recovery (at least one year between identification of the behavioral health concern and application to the training).

TRAINING

This training is for current or former recipients of Behavioral Health services in Georgia, who have an interest in providing peer support services for people who are experiencing a behavioral health concern.

Five Certified Peer Specialist Trainings are held each year in locations throughout the state.

Each training lasts approximately two weeks (Monday through Friday of week one, and Monday through Thursday of week two). There are no classes or scheduled activities on the weekend.

There is an \$85 registration fee (due no later than the first day of training) that covers the cost of training materials. There may be additional costs for lodging depending on whether participants stay at the hotel where the training is held. Hotel costs will vary by location and generally range from \$500 to \$900 for the 2 week stay (excluding weekends). Staying at the hotel is not mandatory, but is recommended for participants with long commutes.

A very few scholarships for the lodging expense are available for each training, and the request for scholarship consideration is on the application form.

LIFE AS A CPS

Certified Peer Specialists are trained to promote hope, personal responsibility, education, empowerment, and self-determination in the communities where they serve.

The Certified Peer Specialist Training provided by the Georgia Mental Health Consumer Network is nationally recognized for its quality and innovation, and graduates who maintain their certification are qualified to provide peer support services that are Medicaid-reimbursable through qualified programs, including Georgia's Community Service Boards.

In order to maintain active certification, graduates are required to achieve and report at least I2 hours of continuing education units each year, and to abide by the ethics guidelines of the Certified Peer Specialist Project.
